Read the information at each station, discuss the question with your partner, then write a brief note below. You do not need to write in full sentences – bullet points and key ideas are fine.

European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR)	A binding international treaty that protects fundamental rights and freedoms, including freedom of thought, conscience and religion.
Equality Act 2010	The law that protects people from discrimination, harassment and victimisation in the UK.
Protected characteristic	Personal features that are legally protected.
Harassment	Unwanted behaviour that violates someone's dignity, or creates an intimidating, humiliating, offensive or hostile environment.
Pressure group	An organisation that campaigns for a particular cause or interest.
Lobbying	Attempting to persuade politicians or decision-makers to support a cause.

Station 1	What makes a belief serious enough to deserve legal protection? <i>I think a belief deserves legal protection if...</i>
Station 2	How is an ethical belief different from a lifestyle choice? <i>I think there is / isn't a meaningful difference because...</i>
Station 3	Was the bank worker's comment harassment or rudeness? <i>I think this comment was/wasn't harassment in a legal sense because...</i>
Station 4	What does this tell us about how UK law works? <i>The fact that clarification is sometimes needed suggests that...</i>
Station 5	What are the pros and cons of using courts to bring about change compared to other forms of citizenship action? <i>Taking a case to court is effective/limited because...</i>
